*\*\*\*The Chapel Hill Ghost Lights are probably the most well known ghost lights in Tennessee, and perhaps second in the South only to the Brown Mountain Lights of North Carolina. They appear along the rail road tracks of Chapel Hill, TN which is located south of Nashville, and is also noted as the burial place of Civil War General Nathan Bedford Forrest. Many of the residence of Chapel Hill have seen them, and no one really knows what causes this bizarre phenomena.*

*The legend is that long ago an aging signal man along the tracks was killed during a dark and rainy night. He had carried a bright lantern which could be seen for miles up the tracks. As he walked the tracks, he accidentally tripped. His head hit the rail, and he was knocked unconscious. He lay on the track for a few minutes, until along came a train. Unable to stop in time, the train ran over the man, decapitating him. When they found his body, they say, it was still mostly intact. Except for one part, that is: his head. It*
